

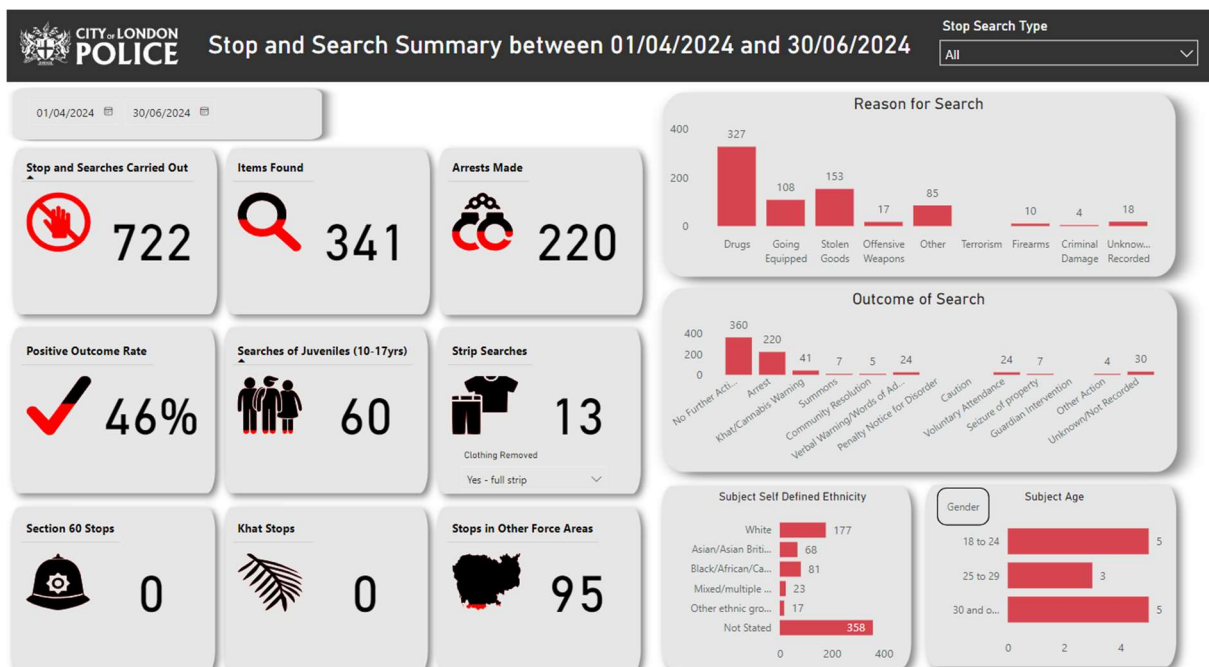


Stop and Search Statistical Data

Reporting Period Q1 2024/25 (April 1st 2024 – June 30th 2024)

This is the main dashboard for the given reporting period and shows an increase from 597 stop searches in the previous month, an increase of 20.9% on the previous month. The number of items found and the arrest rates have increased proportionally. With the growth in searches be proportional to the items found and arrests, it has marginally decreased the outcome rate to 46% but remains above the target rate of 40% for positive outcomes.

There has been an increase in policing operations over this period to address rising acquisitive crime trends that have been seen nationally.



Juvenile searches increased from 41 with the rises seen in overall stop searches in the previous quarter and the number of section 60 stops remains at 0.

Proportionality rates have seen marginal increases and decrease from the previous period where figures were 2.3, 1.4 and 1.0. (National proportionality rates from 2023: Black ethnicity 4.85, meaning a person of black ethnicity is almost five more times likely to be stop searched than a white person, Asian ethnicity 1.58 times more likely to be stop searched than a white person). This is an area that we will endeavour to continually improve through review, scrutiny and service improvements.
